## Flexible apprenticeships



We've exciting news about the shared apprentice scheme in cyber security that we have been working on. In the proposal, apprentices will get the opportunity to work across more than one business, making the scheme more attractive to both apprentices and SMEs. This is a unique scheme, the first in the country though similar schemes operate in other non-technology sectors.

Delivery of these apprenticeships requires CyberNorth to set up a Flexi-Job Apprentice Agency (FJAA), the only legal route to do so, and we have submitted the proposal to the Department for Education.

We will not know the outcome until September but fingers crossed for this exciting and innovative idea.

## It Takes Allsorts : Neurodivergence in the workplace.



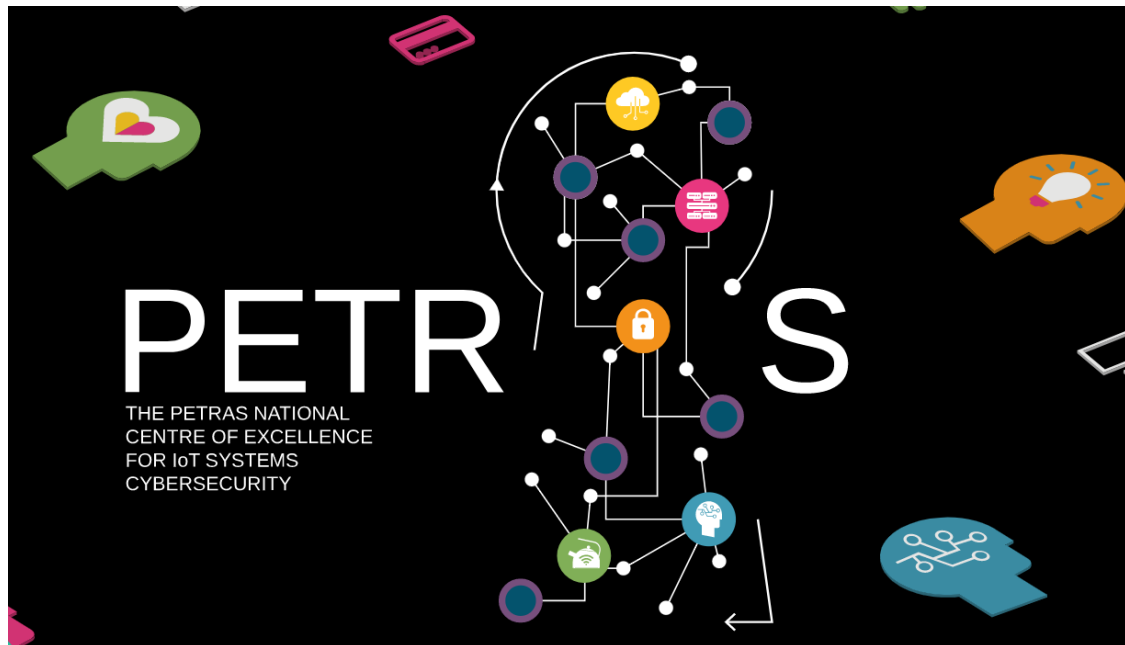
