Flexible Apprenticeships

If at first you don't succeed, try try again!

That's the motto we applied when our application to run a **flexible apprenticeship scheme for cyber security** here in the North East was declined last September by the Department of Education. Like all good troopers, we shed a tear, dusted ourselves off and set about collaborating with a partner to help us achieve this dream.

Our friends at <u>Gateshead College</u> were the partners, and after working together for the past 10 months, we are DELIGHTED (yes, the caps are intentional!) to announce that the Department for Education has given our **Level 4 Flexi Job Apprenticeship, Cyber Security Technologist**, the green light!

From this September, we will now be running the flexible apprenticeship - where each apprentice has four placements with four different businesses lasting six months each. The first of its kind in the UK, we are now working with cyber companies and teams across the region to find these placements for our apprentices.

TECHVETS

Ex-forces people into Cyber

CyberNorth, supported by the Department for Science, Innovation and Technology (DSIT), is working with the <u>TechVets</u> charity to get ex-forces people into cyber security positions across the region by providing a year long subsidy to employers, offsetting some of the cost of employment, reducing the risk to the employer.

The North East has the highest number of unemployed ex-forces people of any English region and TechVets works to provide a bridge for veterans, service leavers, reservists, and their families into information technology careers.

The subsidy of £7,500 for the first year is available for 5 positions. During this time, the employee will continue to be supported through the charity.


